Tito and Ranjana Chaudhuri extended their cramped reception room to add a contemporary dining area with a home office and plenty of space for family living.

"She needed the dinner table for her work and when we ate as a family she would have to clear everything away. I suggested extending the lounge so we could use the existing space as a dining area and the extra space as a lounge and office.

"I did have ulterior motives. As an architect I had a vision of a contemporary addition to my home using materials like steel, aluminium, glass and concrete; and the planners agreed. Walls were made of concrete in large steel moulds with a glass roof, but this was only possible thanks to our neighbours allowing us to bring everything across their land as we had no exterior access to our property and there was no way we could bring the materials through the house."

"Tito had solar reflective film applied inside the glass,"
Ranjana explains. "At night time the roof is completely
mirrored. It creates an extraordinarily dramatic effect. I
absolutely love it. I took a while to be convinced by his plans
but he was right. It's a wonderful addition to our home, I
could sit here all evening.
