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Extension to Private House

This scheme is an architect's addition to his own house in north London, designed essentially from three materials: concrete, glass and Bath stone. The extension, with a complete structural glass roof and wall to the landscaped garden, invites the exterior in. The hand polished *in situ* concrete walls are left bare. They contrast well with the white painted walls of the original interior and now the extended room presents a series of layers, starting from a study area with a

mobile desk - designed by the architect for his doctor wife - a comfortable dining area surrounded by artwork and finally the sitting area within the new extension. The birch plywood for the internal concrete-face formwork was cleaned and polished and reused as external cladding. The reconstituted Bath stone on the patio extends from the sitting area and is on the same level. The extension is a subtle transition from the interior to the exterior.
